

Last week MVNS coordinated and held a very successful training event for local community service, health and education providers with Nairn Walker from Social Solutions (Tasmania). This attracted 100 participants. The ultimate aim of this training is to provide strategies for workers and services to work more effectively with people through acceptance and empowerment through choices.
